**SUBJECT: CONDUCT OF DIVISION TRAINING WORKSHOP ON THE DEVELOPMENT OF
CONTEXTUALIZED LEARNING MATERIALS FOR KINDERGARTEN TO GRADE XII
LEARNERS (LOCAL LITERATURE) IN SCHOOLS USING IP LANGUAGES**

This is to announce the upcoming Division Training Workshop on the Development of Contextualized Learning Materials for Kindergarten to Grade III Learners (Local Literature) in Schools using IP Languages for MTB-MLE Subject to be held at the Davidson Hotel and Restaurant on October 6, 7, and 14, 2023.

The objectives of the training are:

1. To elevate the educational experience of the young learners by engaging them with localized learning resources particularly on local literature written in their own language. The use of Indigenous Peoples (IP) languages in the Mother Tongue-Based Multilingual Education (MTB-MLE) subject is a testament to our commitment to inclusivity, cultural preservation, and fostering a holistic learning environment.
2. To serve as a platform for teachers to delve into the development of contextualized learning materials that incorporate local literature and IP languages into the curriculum for kindergarten to Grade III learners.
3. To come up with a resource material containing Indigenous literature in various forms which will serve as learning resource for the elementary learners.

The participants to this training are the Tabuk City participants to the Regional IGABAY workshop and the identified secondary and elementary IP school heads and teachers who are knowledgeable about the Indigenous Peoples literature and who are willing to contribute this knowledge for the attainment of the objectives of this training. The list of these participants is in enclosure A of this memorandum.

The participants are advised to bring with them the soft copy of the literary pieces they have gathered, their laptop, and extension cord.

The meals and snacks for all the participants will be charged to the 2022 IPED continuing fund subject to usual accounting rules and regulations.

A two-day service credit will be granted to the participants in lieu of October 7 and 14.
